Minutes.

The Minutes of the 56th. Annual General Meeting, held on the 9th. September 1981 at the Alexander Stadium had been circulated and were passed as a true record of the meeting after they had been proposed by K.Dare and seconded by C.Grant. There were no matters arrising.

A vote of thanks was proposed by the Treasurer to the Auditor Mr. David McNamee. This vote of thanks was endorsed by the delegates present.

Presidents Report.

Mr. Ken Walklate told the meeting that he had been to races in each of the three divisions and had enjoyed the Sport and the organisation at all of them. He also stated that it was the first time he had ever been to a third division fixture. He particularly found the final race in division one exciting when Sperkhill took the League title by a mere one point from Staffordshire Moorlands. Finally he thanked the delegates for electing him to Office he considered it a great honour to be elected President of what he believed to be the best Cross Country League in the Country, he backed this statement by saying that any League that can provide four teams in the first five teams home in the National must be worthy of this praise. He also congratulated David Moorcroft and Tom O'Reilly for their athletic achievements during the past year.

Secretary's Report.

A near disaster happened at the end of the first race held at Wolverhampton, with only about thirty athletes home all the finishing discs were accidentally dropped on the ground. However, with quick thinking Officials and the tremendous cooperation of all the athletes the result was in fact got out in record time and without missing one single runner. The race was won by Bob Westwood of Tipton from Andy Wilton Staffs Moorland. Former University runner Mark Burnhope of Sparkhill was third. Tipton 93pts. came out as top team followed by Sparkhill 111pts. and Staffs. Moorland 122pts. Only

fourty four points at this stage seperated the bottom four Clubs. Birchfield's parkland course saw A. Bristow of the University win the second fixture, he beat 8.Westwood with Terry Colton of Wolverhampton third. Birchfield 82pts. pulled

out all the stops on their own course beating the powerful Tipton team 96pts. The consistent Staffs Moorland team were third with 130pts.

In this penultimate fixture promoted by Sparkhill, Birchfield filled the first three places with Darren Pemberton, Ray Smedley and Richard Partridge. However despite this magnificent start the black vested men from Birchfield had to play second fiddle to Sparkhill who packed all their scoring six in the first eighteen home.

- the two Clubs finishing first and second in the 2nd. and 3rd.Divisions to move to the higher Divisions, and the two Clubs finishing at the bottom of the tables in Division 1 & 2 to move into lower Divisions. Winners and Runners up in each Division to recieve League awards respectively, also the Individual winner, on points, in each Division to recieve a League award.
- 7. That the distances of races be from 5 to 7 miles, and races to be decided on Championship lines.
- 18. Affiliation Fee to be decided at the Annual General Meeting (at present £6 00.) per Club, per Annum. Numbers and results sheets to be supplied by the League.
- Any Club which fails to pay its Affiliation Fee prior to the first race, after the date of the A.G.M. shall have their invitation withdrawn from the League.
 - 10. Each race shall be in the charge of an appointed Referse whose decision shall be final.League Timekeepers for each Division shall also be appointed at the A.G.H. and will be responsible for giving and recording the Official Times at each race. The races to be started by an appointed starter.
 - 11. The Hon. Secretary of the promoting Club shall arrange judges , Officials and FIRST AID cover for each race, and a disc system of scoring shall be used. Each Club will provide its own disc steward.
 - 12. Any Club failing to complete a team in all fixtures shall automatically finish at the bottom of the table in the final League placings. Failing to complete a team in the Third Division fixtures shall mean that the Club applies in writing (before the next Annual General Meeting) to the Hon. Secretary for re-election to the League.
 - 13. The dates and venues of all League races shall be decided at the Annual General Meeting.
 - 14. The Hon. Secretary of each promoting Club MUST inform all Clubs in his Division, the Preident, Hon. Secretary, Race Secretary, the Referee, and the Timekeepers as to the venue, travel details and the type and distance of the course at least 14 days before the race is to be run.
 - 15. Club Colours must be worn. The Referee will disqualify any athlete who does not comply with this rule.
 - 16. Safety pins are not provided by the League for athletes numbers, this is the responsibility of individual Clubs to provide. The Leagues judges would appreciate if athletes could pin their numbers on the sides, rather than top and bottom of the number.
- 17. The Young Athletes race shall be for boys who are over 13 years but under 17 years of age on the 1st.September prior to the first League race of the season. The distance of the races shall NOT exceed 3 miles.
- 5 18. The responsibility for the up to date engraving of the League Trophies, is that of the holding Club.

REMINDER :--

The Affiliation of £6 - 00.is now due, no Club will be allowed to compete in the first League Race until their affiliation is paid.

Discussion Paper One.

Without wishing to burden the League or Clubs with unnecessary meetings and rules. (The joy of the Birmingham League is its simplicity and straight forward manner of working) There have been two occasions this bast season when it would have been helpful to have had an executive committee or a General Meeting that would have the power to take decisions on the day to day running of the League or to act as an appeals committee.

1. General Meeting. (The best time to hold this meeting would probably be after the first two races.)

i) If this suggestion was taken up then the advantage would be that the Club's would have another chance each year to express their views - more consultation on League matters.

ii) A wider body of oppinion would be consulted if any Club had a protest.

Disadvantages.

Yet another meeting to attend.

ii) Some years there would be virtually nothing to discuss. -A meeting just for the sake of having a meeting.

iii) With a larger body meeting it may be more difficult to come to a consensus of oppinion.

2. Executive Committee.

Advantages,

i) Small body of people - Would suggest the President, Hon. Secretary and two or three other members elected by the A.G.M.

ii) Would only need to meet when circumstances demanded. - The Executive

Committee might not even have to meet at all.

iii) For some smaller decisions the Secretary could even get a consensus of

oppinion over the phone.

iv) Decisions would be more democratic than at the present time, where the Secretary takes decisions on his own, usually having consulted senior Cross-Country Officials in the area. These Illustrious persons however may not be the choice of the A.G.M.

v) An Executive Committee would be an ideal body to which Clubs could appeal if they felt it necessary

Disadvantages.

i) Clubs would be leaving some decisions to a small select number of persons,

all be it, elected by the A.G.M.

ii) It would bring perhaps a degree of more formality into the proceedings of the League, but hopefully, would not destroy the friendly atmosphere generated by the member Clubs.

Disadvantages. i) The number of Clubs able to offer to stage promotions will diminish due to the large increase in numbers. ii) The burden on the Race Secretary's would be increased. iii) The number of Officials for each division would need to be increased to cope with the greater number of athletes. 2. Keep the quantity of Clubs at the present level. Putting new applications to the League into a vote with those Clubs who have to re-apply for re- election each year to the League. This vote to be taken by the A.G.M. each September. Advantages. i) Easy to administer keeps the level of League competition high. Disadvantage. Does not promote the Sport by allowing new Clubs into the League or support the smaller weaker Clubs. 3. To bring in a Fourth Division, leaving say twelve Clubs in division three, leaving all the other Clubs and any new applications to make up Division Four. i) This will continue to promote the sport by allowing new Clubs into the League. ii) Will make the League more competitive to the Clubs who are at present in the bottom third of the Third Divisiom, these Clubs would be the likely contenders for the new Fourth Division. iii) Quite easy to administer. Disadvantages. i) There will be a problem of getting extra Officials to run the extra division. ii) Could be a problem in finding four new venues for a fourth Division. At present it tends to be the Clubs in the top third of division three that are promoting League fixtures. 4. To keep the first two divisions as they are and then to split the Third Division into two.Looking at the Goegraphy of the Clubs situation, i.e. rather like the old football League system - third division North, Third division South Advantages. i) It would keep two reasonably strong and equally balanced divisions ii) Smaller Clubs would have less distance to travell for races. iii) Easy to administer. Disadvantages. i) An extra set of Officials would be required. Four more venues for fixtures would need to be found. iii) Some adjustment would have to be made to these divisions each year depending on who has been relegated from division two. Secretary's Report.

Division One.

Staffordshire Moorlands who won three out of the four fixtures were comfortable winners of this Division. The only Club to beat them were last years winners Sparkhill Harriers in the third race. Coventry Godiva Harriers ran consistantly to take the number two spot in the League, their highest placing since the 1973-79 season. Tipton Harriers were fourth.

Individually the First Division provided four different winners R.Westwood (Tipton), A.Bristow(B'hem University) R.Partridge (Birchfield) and A.Wilton (Staffs.Moorland). However it was fitting that Andy Wilton should win the last race as he had finished no lower than second in the other three fixtures. This of course gave him the most consistant Individuals Placque.

Only two Clubs finished a team in the Young Athletes races. Gloucester A.C. just beating Tipton Harriers by five points. Nathan Sishop Gloucester A.C. was the leading Young Athlete.

Division Two.

An excellent team battle took place between City of Stoke and Wolverhampton and Bilston, with the Wolves getting a great start by winning the first two League races from Stoke who were runners up on both occassions. However City of Stoke weathered the Christmas celebrations better than their Wolverhampton counter-parts turning on the power to comfortably take the final two races, whilst Wolverhampton struggled to find their form and to get their strongest team out. In winning these two races Stoke overhauled their rivals to become Division Two Champions, Wolverhampton hanging on for the second promotion spot.

Despite Paul Davies-Hale winning two races, the other two being won by Terry Colton (Wolves) and Tim Redman (Leamington), the Leading runners placque went to Clinton Bradeley (Stoke) who finished 6th;5th;2nd and 4th.A remarkable achievement considering that only the year before he had been winning the Young Athletes Placque in the same Division. Certainly this is an athlete to watch in the future after this promising start to his Senior carreer.

Like the First Division only two Clubs completed a team in all four League races Cannock beating Warley quite comfortably.K.McFarlane (Cannock) had done enough in winning the first three races to be the leading young athlete, despite finishing third in the final race.

Division Three.

Huge fields and good competition were the high-light of this Division. Stourport started the season on a high note by winning the first League race, but then the more experienced Telford showed their time in the higher division was not wasted and won the next three races to take the Division Three Title. Stourport hang on to take the second spot It is always pleasant to see another Club arrive on the scene and this year saw the Wenlock Olympians team finish third after struggling for the last few years to field a Senior team.

M.Dalloway (Stourport) won the first two races with R.Bradley (Wenlock) taking the third race and S.James (Numerton the last one. In finishing not lower than second in any of the races R.Bradley won the leading athletes plague.

Dudley and Stourbridge were the only Club to complete a team in all four fixtures in the Young Athletes Races. However there was a splendid performance by G. Cowdrill (Iclford who wen all four races.

The Secretary applogised to Telford, Stourport and Wenlock for not having the Winners Placques at the final League Race, this was due entirely to an administritive slip up on his part. He also informed Telford that he had been trying to get the third Division Trophy back from Loughborough University, However it transpired that the Trophy had now been handed over to them.

Finally the Secretary thanked the President Basil Heatley for his support and advice throughout the year.

Correspondence.

i) The Secretary explained a letter from Loughborough University saying that they had recieved no information or directions to the second League Race and asking for that fixture to be declared void. However at the first Division Two fixture the Secretary had been present and had ascertained that Jack Buckner was the University Captain he then duly passed this information to Nick Piotrowski (Warley) who then promptly handed the directions for the second fixture to Jack Buckner as he had done to all the other competing Clubs that afternoon.

As the fault for the unfortunate mistake seemed to be in the hands of poor internal communications at Loughborough and that the University in common with every Club in the League had been sent a sheet with all competing Clubs secretaries and their home addresses and where-ever possible their Phone Numbers the Secretary took the decision that the race result should stand. The meeting endorsed the decision of the Secretary in

this matter.

ii) The second piece of correspondence came from Newcastle A.C. with regard to the disqualification of one of their athletes in the second League Raca. With the help of other senior cross-country Officials the Secretary had looked into the matter and had decided that with the information available to him that the Race Referee had no alternative to the decision that he took, and his decision was upheld. However together with Newcastle the secretary wondered if protests should not come through the Clubs Team-manager and not from individual athletes, although this found some support when David Johnson, one of the Leagues Referees, stated that he would wish to interview the athletes to gain first hand knowledge of the situation it was generally agreed to make no changes to the present method.

After some discussion a proposal by Bill Adcocks (Coventry) that the Association should have an Executive Committee was passed unanimously. There then continued further discussion on how the Executive should be constituted, which was finally resolved by asking the Secretary in conjunction with Senior Cross Gountry Officials to formulate a proposal for next years A.G.M. The proposal or proposals to be sent out with next years agenda for the A.G.M.

Structure of the League (Discussion Paper Two.)

The President started proceedings on this topic by explaining that six new Clubs had applied to join the League for the coming season: Alvis Running Club; Centurion Joggers; Harper Adams Agricultural College; Northbrook A.C.; Potteries Marathon A.C. and Sandwell Valley Running Club. Of these Alvis Running Club and Northbrook A.C. were not affiliated to the M.C.C.C.A. therefore they could not be considered for membership of the League as the rules state that any Club wishing to join the League must be affiliated to the M.C.C.C.A.

The Secretary also reminded the President that there were three Clubs who had reapplied to join the League :- Draitwich A.C.; Harborne Harriers; and West Bromwich Harriers. These Clubs were all re-elected on block. Aston University had not reapplied to join the League.

The President then put to the meeting the question of whether they were in favour or not of the four Clubs being given an invitation to join the League John Nolan proposed and Keith Banks seconded a proposal that the Clubs be given an invitation to

join the League Proposal bassed by 33votes to 11 against.

It was then agreed in principal that the present structure of the League had just about reached saturation point, however after discussion with possible third division Clubs who might promote a fixture in the coming season, it was decided to add the new Clubs to the Third Division and to leave the first and second divisions as they stand

at present.

If there are new Clubs applying next season then the League, if it is to accept new applicants, will have to look into the possibility of forming a fourth division of some description or other. The Secretary then made the point that if new clubs were accepted then he thought a maximum of 800 athletes could be coped with by himself when doing the results, without making life too unbearable for him.

Minutes of Adhok Committee held at Basil Heatleys house on Monday the 21stwof May 84

As instructed by the last A.G.M. the secretary called a meeting of leading Cross Country Officials in the area to discuss:-Item one The A.G.M. recomendation that an Executive Committee be formed to oversee the League

Item two. The ever increasing problem of numbers of Clubs and Athletes competing in the Leaguell

Present at the Meeting.

Ken Dare (President E.C.C.U.); Jim Skidmore (President M.C.C.C.A./Race Referee); Ken Evans (President Birmingham & District Cross-Country League); Basil Heatley (Secretary M.C.C.C.A.); David Johnson (Race Referee); and Cliff Franks (Hon. Secretary of League).

Apologies for Absence.

Ken Walklate (Race Referee)

After a brief discussion it was unamously agreed that this adhok committee should recomend the following format for an executive committee for the Birmingham and District Invitation Cross Country League to the A.G.M. in September.

The Executive Committee shall consist of:-

i) The President. ii) The Hon. Secretary iii) The Race Referees

iv) One representative from each of the Divisions, to be elected each year at the A.G.M.

This Executive should be instructed to meet once a year after the close of each season to discuss relevant matters from the proceding season. Perhaps, one of the duties of this committee shall be to make recommendations for items for discussion at the next A.G.M.

Also this Executive would have the powers of an appeals committee and as such could be asked to meet, at the discretion of the Secretary if

any problems arrise through out the season.

Item Two.

This item caused a great deal of discussion and many of the issues raised in the Discussion Paper Two, which was put to last years A.G.M., were talked through at length. There was by no means unanimous agreement over any of the items in the discussion document, however after much talk it was agreed to put the following proposal to the next A.G.M.to change the constitution of the League:-

Rule 6 shall be altered to read:-That the League be divided into four divisions containing Clubs of equal strength . The two Clubs finishing first and second in the 2nd., 3rd., and 4th. Divisions to move to the higher Division, and the two Clubs at the bottom of the tables in Division: 1;2 and 3 to move into a lower division. Winners and runners up in each Division to receive League awards respectively, also the Individual winner, on points, in each Division to receive a League award.

It was agreed that the recommended format for each Division should be as follows:-

1st Division 10 teams. 2nd. Division 12 teams. 3rd. Division 10 teams.

4th. Division The rest of the teams. This proposal is to be put to the A.G.M. at the beginning of the meeting, so that the proposal, if passed, can be instituted for the 1984 - 85 season.

Two problems arrise from the above proposal:-

a) The need to find four more venues, perhaps Clubs that are now in the third Division could look to the possibilities of putting on a League fixture.

b) Extra Officials will be needed. At the moment we are running the three Divisions on the minimum number of Officials possible. Clubs in all Divisions could help the League considerably if they have Officials who would come out and help the League as Judges; Time-keepers; Recorders; Disc Stewards; Funnel Stewards or as a Race Secretary.

It was recommended by the adhok committee that a seperate Declaration s sheet be provided to each Club for each seperate Race, this would then solve the problems of having to buy extra numbers to cope with the numbers of athletes now competing in the League.

There being no other business the meeting ended with a vote of thanks to Basil Heatley and his wife for providing refreshments and a venue for

the meeting.

Pre-Agenda Item.

Before the meeting was officially opened by the President a pre-agenda item was discussed. The recommendation from the adhok committee that rule six should be altered to include reference to a fourth division was very fully talked through. The Pros and cons were aired fully with the following points taking up much of the discussion:-Points for:-The fields were now getting so big that it was becoming increasingly difficult

to cope a) with finding venues and b) for the overworked Officials. The opportunity for encouraging new Clubs to partake in the sport of Cross-Country would still be possible. If a new division was not formed then the

number of Clubs would have to remain as at present.

Points against:- The finding of four more venues might present a problem. Finding a complete team of race Officials from the Clubs in Division four would also be a problem.

The Secretary informed the meeting that he felt he would not wish to cope with more than a thousand athletes when doing the results.

After giving the topic some three quarters of an hour discussion the President called for a vote which resulted in an overwhelming majority in favour of forming a fourth division. The A.G.M. proper was then allowed to proceed with:-Minutes of the 58th.A.G.M.

The minutes of this meeting held on Wednesday the 21st. September 1983 had been circulated and were passed as a true record after a proposal by K. Walklate which was seconded by J, Nolan.

Matters arrising The Secretary informed the meeting that he had taken photographs of all the Leagues trophies. It was agreed that these photographs be kept in the minute book.

Statement of Accounts.

The Treasurer went through the balance sheet showing how the League had made a surplus over the year of £165-33p. The main reason for the turn about in the League finances was due in the main to the increased affiliation fees last year. The Hon. Auditer D. McNamee told the meeting that he had studied the accounts and had found them correct. The meeting thanked the auditor for his work on

behalf of the association in auditing the Leagues books.

D. Johnson proposed and J. Freeman seconded that the accounts be accepted, this proposal was carried unanimously. A vote of thanks was given to the Treasurer. Presidents Report.

The President reported that he had thoroughly enjoyed his year as President and that it put the icing on the cake after being associated with the League for thirty five years, firstly as an athlete and then as an official. He was impressed with the standard of the promotions in division two and threeand at the rapid way in which they got the results out

He was also impressed with the standard of running from some of the new Clubs to the League, who started out catering for the joggers of the community and who had now developed very competitive teams. Congratulations were given to Birchfield, Cannock and Massey Ferguson who had all won their respective division of the League.

Briefly the President went on to outline some of the good performances

By Birmingham League Clubs and athletes in the National and Area Championships, especially to Andy Holden and John Wilde.

The one disapointing note was the poor turn out of Young Athletes in the races put on for them by the League. He would like to see Clubs bringing more of their

Young Athletes to League races.

Ken ended his report by thanking all of the Officials, Clubs who promoted fixtures for all of their work in making the League so successful. Finally he thanked the delegates for having made him President. Secretary's Report.

Division One.

Birchfield produced their first Championship League win since 1956, they had a marvelous season winning all four League races ending up with the exceptionally low agregate total of 261 points. Tipton finished runners up with Staffordshire Moorlands third.

Andy Holden who finished 9th;3rd;3rd;and4th, took the individual title and it was pleasing to see him go or to gain selection for England in the World Crose-Country Championships in New York. The division itself supplied four different individual winners for the second year running Winners of the four races were Dave Moorcroft (Coventry); Richard Partridge and Steve Emson (Birchfield) and John Wilde (Tipton)

Division Two. Like the first division this division turned cut to be a one horse race with Cannock winning all four races comfortably. The second promotion spot, however, was keenly contested with first Worcester and Halesowen making the early challenge only to be overhauled by Warley and Bromsgrove and Redditch in the last two races. Bromsgrove finishing the stronger of the two and clinching the second promotion spot.

Despite Cannock providing all four individual winners as well, Paul Davies-Hale winning three races and Kenny Baker taking the other, Ian Atkins of Worcester won the

Individual title with 21 points.

Division Three.

The third division provided the most exciting team races of all three divisions with Numeaton making the early running, holding the League leadership after the first two races. However, Massey Ferguson were getting stronger with every race and took over the League leadership after the third race, a lead they were not to relinquish. Nuneaton still held the second premotion spot but Wenlock had closed to within 30 points of the Warwickshire Club with one race to go. On discussion of the Secretary's Report, the question was raised of why it takes so long for the results to appear in Athletics Weekly. The meeting was informed by some of its members that some of their Club athletes had complained about how long the results took to get in the magazine. The Secretary then made the statement that he got the results to athletics Weekly as soon as it was possible for him to do so i.e. the same time if not slightly before the Clubs received their full copy of the results. However he thought that it was perhaps the policy of Athletics Weekly to put in all the League results for a particular Saturday in at the same time. Hence it was usually four to five weeks after the race had taken place before it was printed. He added that he thought the Birmingham League usually did very well compared with other Leagues on the number of finishers that Athletics Weekly printed.

One solution to the problem put forward was that the first ten from each division be sent to athletics Weekly with the first three teams. This was however dismissed by the meeting in favour of the Secretary writing to the Editor asking if it would be possible

for the League to have its results put in more promptly.

G.Heeley proposed and K.Dare seconded the adoption of the Presidents and Secrearys Reports with a vote of thanks to both of them. This was unanimously carried.
