

Proposals etc. for League Programme for the coming season.

At the outset, the Harborne delegates informed the meeting that they were present at the request of their committee to ascertain what conditions they would have to fulfill should they become members. Those present were greatly in favour of their joining, but until the matter had been put before their Committee, they regretted that they could give no definite promise at the moment.

The Chairman stated that should they decide to join, Harborne Harriers would be welcomed as a most suitable Club, their courses, accommodation, and management, being all that could be desired. It was decided that the Harborne delegates be invited to take part in the discussion, with voting power if necessary.

Mr. J. Mc. Kenna proposed that the method of racing be altered from home and away fixtures to a combined run of all Clubs at each headquarters. He agreed that the home and away fixtures last season were most enjoyable, but that no harm would be done to make a further experiment.

The proposal was seconded by Mr. R. S. Angell.

In support of the proposal, Mr. B. Dashford stated that with combined races, and large amount of useful experience would be gained, for the races would resemble miniature championships. In each race there would be upwards of 150 runners, and it would mean that each club would have to make special arrangements on one Saturday in the season for their accommodation. Further, the period of racing would be decreased, and such a competition would mean that there would probably a direct championship result obtainable, and, we should therefore, not be called upon to bear the cost of two sets of Gold Medals.

After a long discussion, the motion was eventually carried.

It was decided that a copy of these minutes be sent to the Clubs who were not represented, asking them to let us have their views in good time to enable us to go prepared with our programme to the Midland Counties A.C.C. Association meeting on Thursday Aug. 26th.

It was decided that a delegates meeting should be held in the second week of September for the purpose of drawing up rules of competition etc.

The meeting was then declared closed with a vote of thanks to the Chairman.
