Annual Report and Balance Sheet. Mr.Weaver stated that both sections of the League had been fairly well supported, with Tipton H. winning the championship shield for the eighth successive season. The accounts showed a surplus on the season's working of 7/10d, representing a satisfactory state of affairs in view of the fact that the cost of medals was double that of pre-war days. The balance now in favour of the League now stood at £8.14. 2.

It was proposed by C.D.Smith, second by C.M.Walsh, and carried, that the report be accepted.

The question of the Hon.Sec's honorarium was raised, and Mr.Weaver stated it was his wish that it had not been paid, as he did not desire to show a deficit on the season's working.

Thanks were accorded Mr.E.W.Lindsey for having audited the accounts.

Minutes of the 2nd Annual Meeting held at The White Horse Hotel, Birmingham on September 10th 1946.

The President, Mr C. H. Frame (Sparkhill 86) took the chair, with a large number of club representatives present.

awarding Mr F. Gull asked whether the awards for Division 2 had been made in accordance with agreement, viz one set. The Secretary stated that 2 sets had inadvertently been given.

accounts The statement of accounts as circulated was approved. (cash in hand £15.0.11)

Report The Secretary gave his report, indicating that the respective champions had been Tipton 10 (dw 1) and Sparkhill 86 (dw 2). Medals had been awarded by Mr Cannon to J. J. Holden and G. Brown, considered best performers in the respective divisions. The report was adopted, with a desire that reference be made in the Minutes to the great honours brought to the League by J. J. Holden, Jack Barwick, J. Froggatt, J. Orfield, J. Cole, R. W. A. Kier, also of whom had taken part in the 1946 International Championship.

Also arising from the report, Mr Gleeson complained that a League medal had been given to B. Inwaley despite it having been ruled that he was ineligible to represent

Tipton Harness, and asked that the return of the Medal be called for. Mr Chelton stated that Twamley had lost the medal, but that he was willing to return it if and when found. The Tipton club was instructed to pass the medal on to the next scorer after a lengthy discussion had ensued on the matter.
