Not since the legendary days of Jack Holden have Tipton provided an individual winner in a Birmingham League division one race but at Stoke on Saturday, Great Britain international, Allan Rushmer, bridged a 20-year gap with a convincing success.

Rushmer, who has not enjoyed the best of fortunes on the cross country scene recently, came back with a bang over a five and a half mile heavy course to win by six seconds from the Staffordshire, Midlands and inter-counties youths champion, David Black.
